### Online Learning Policy - for Students

St Patrick's College is a BYOD (Bring your own device) school. Students do a mix of online learning and usual classroom learning without a device. Teachers use a range of technological teaching activities to support digital learning.

Digital tools Teachers currently use:

- Email
- Google Docs
- Hapara
- MyMaths
- Youtube
- Google Classroom
- Powerpoint and/or Google Slides
- Education Perfect
- Clickview
- Turnitin

If students were unable to attend College for a sustained period of time, the above tools could be used to deliver key elements of the curriculum.

Teachers would communicate to students via email or Google Classroom, and tasks would be set via those platforms. We would also expect students to take any textbooks and workbooks they might have home.

Teachers would set work and mark the work and provide feedback for the students. This would most likely be done through the assignment function on Google Classroom. Teachers would not necessarily be available for commenting during usual scheduled class Periods. Please note that most teachers teach between 100 and 150 students.

If a student does not have access to a computer, the College Library could look to lend some out. Internet access at home would be required and students would need to arrange this in advance.

Assessments may or may not happen depending on circumstances. Some tasks can be done at home, however other assessments need to be completed in class. Deadlines may be shifted as the need arises.

If a teacher or someone in their family was to get sick, the College would not expect that teacher to continue to provide work or resources for their students. Students would need to revise and continue on with the work they have already been set.
